## Asian coal prices ease as pollution controls bite

(Montel) Benchmark Asian coal prices slid 1% in the week through to Thursday amid signs of growing pressure to cut air pollution among northeast Asian consumers as well as elevated Chinese inventories.

The Newcastle index, a reference price for high grade (6,000 kcal/kg) Australian coal exports to Asia, last stood at USD 67.77/t, down USD 0.74 week on week.

Traders highlighted pressure from regulatory announcements this week after paper prices for December delivery slumped as much as 5% from a high of 71/t on Monday.

## Australian coal miners reroute lost volumes to China

(Montel) Australia managed to grow its thermal coal exports by 2% in the year through April, despite customs delays forcing a sharp slowdown in volumes to China, analysts told Montel.

Australia shipped 66.4m tonnes of thermal coal in the first four months of the year, compared to 65.2m tonnes over the same period last year, said IHS Markit director of coal Scott Dendy.

This was despite a 17% drop in exports to China that came in at just 14m tonnes.

## China, India thermal coal imports hit multi-year highs in May

SINGAPORE, May 31 (Reuters) - Seaborne thermal coal imports by China and India hit multi-year highs in May, shipping data showed on Friday, contrasting with trends in other regions where there is a shift towards cleaner electricity sources like natural gas and renewables.

China's shipped imports of thermal coal, which is used mostly for power generation, will reach 17 million tonnes in May, data in Refinitiv showed, the highest level since at least 2015, and up from around 12 million tonnes a year ago.

"Pat Markey, managing director of Singapore-based Sierra Vista Resources, said Taiwanese restrictions on the 5.5 GW Taichung power plant were likely to reduce the country's demand by 2m tonnes next year, including 1m tonnes of high calorific Australian fuel.

"A plunge in sales of the 5,500kcal/kg thermal coal that is typically sold to China has compelled Australian miners to look for alternative markets or to blend their coal to meet other customers' specifications", said Pat Markey, managing director of Singapore-based Sierra Vista

Sierra Vista's Markey said, "India's economic growth of 7% this year "will help to continue to support the need for increased power generation."
